## ADDITIONAL ITEMS RELATED TO THE MAJOR

-Students must be admitted to Teacher Education before taking professional core EDU & RDG courses.  
 -Take the appropriate PRAXIS exams required for licensure for this major. Contact the College of Education Licensure Officer for information regarding the PRAXIS exams.  
 -Middle Grades Majors: Must choose one of the following options: Option 1: ENG 101, 102, 225, 235, 305, and 310; Option 2: BIO 111, 112, PHS 111, 112, and 6 BIO/PHS upper division hours; Option 3: HIS 111, 112, 221, 222, 424, and POL 231 or 232; Option 4: MAT 100, 206, 235, and 306, and 2 of the following: CIS171, MAT120, MAT240. Note: Students who elect Option 2 or Option 4 may count the upper division requirement for the upper division math/science elective.  
 \*Fulfills additional requirement for 3-4 hours of math or science for the B.S. degree.

**The following guidelines are important. Failure to follow these guidelines may delay graduation.**

1. Plan schedules carefully. Plan to fulfill prerequisites for future courses.
2. Do not alter the sequence of courses without consulting with your academic advisor as not all classes are offered every semester.
3. Before the enrollment period, check to make sure holds will not prevent you from registration.
4. Register for classes early during the registration period to secure classes.
5. If you plan to study abroad for a semester, please consult your academic advisor at your earliest convenience to ensure there is no delay in course sequencing or graduation.
