### WHAT'S NEW AT THE 2025 LECTURESHIP?

There are elements of the Lectureship that are favorites from year to year, but this year there are several new aspects of the program that we hope will be among your favorites this year.

- 1. A Balanced Focus on the Text of Genesis It would be easy to plan a Lectureship on just the first twelve chapters of Genesis, but we want to give attention to the text and theology of the whole book. The Lectureship has been designed to address questions related to the Nature of God (1:30 p.m., Mon.-Thurs., Aud A; 2:30 p.m., Mon-Thurs, Dryden Main Floor), the Nature of Humankind (8:30 a.m., Tues.-Thurs., Aud D), the Archaeology of Genesis (8:30 a.m., Tues.-Thurs., Aud B), and Key Characters (including a three-day series on Joseph led by Dan Winkler and 27 sessions related to characters highlighted in our two 2025 Lectureship books). In addition to the chapel sessions and keynotes, other sessions specifically connected to Genesis include a survey of the whole book (Mon., 8:30-10:20 a.m., Dryden Main Floor).
- 2. Expanded College Ministry and Youth and Family Ministry Workshops On Monday, March 17, a one-day Youth and Family Workshop, hosted by Ben Coleman, will feature 19 sessions and almost 30 speakers or panelists who desire to help attendees grow in ministering to children, families and youth. Also on Wednesday, March 19, the Lectureship will feature a "College Ministry Workshop," led by Dr. Matt Sokoloski, which will help attendees grow in their ability to reach and serve college students in a variety of contexts. The four sessions begin at 8:30 a.m., 9:30 a.m., 1:30 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. and feature speakers and panelists including Scott Jefcoat, Andrew Kingsley and Boo Scott.
- 3. Strengthening the Family The role of family in Genesis and the pressing need for helpful family ministries has led to an effort to emphasize healthy marriages and families in the 2025 program. On Tuesday-Thursday mornings at 9:30 the series on the main floor of Dryden will address how families can address the challenges of favoritism, sexual immorality and unhealthy conflict in the home. Also, a series of lessons on Monday-Thursday afternoons at 1:30 p.m. in Butts Family Conference Room hosted by Dr. Ryan Fraser will serve to strengthen marriages, while also encouraging those struggling with infertility or other family communication challenges.
- 4. Apologetics Emphasis Christians and congregations are constantly being challenged with how to engage the sciences and even skeptics, and the 2025 Lectureship has been designed with some of those challenges in mind. David Tarbet will lead a series in the ARC, near the Bible collection he donated to FHU, over four days titled "How We Got the Bible" (Mon.-Thurs., 11:30 a.m.). Another series will address how to build a healthy model of creation, especially as related to the questions those in the sciences might bring to the text of Scripture (Mon.-Thurs., 12:30 p.m., Aud C), while there will also be a series on sexual ethics from Genesis (Mon.-Thurs., 12:30 p.m., Aud B).

We have prayerfully prepared every session and series in the 2025 Lectureship with hopes that God will be glorified and attendees will grow in faith. We hope you will take advantage of each of these opportunities.

### **APPRECIATION DINNER TO HONOR ROY & JAN SHARP**

The 2025 FHU Annual Bible Lectureship is dedicated to Roy and Jan Sharp. It is difficult to imagine two people who could have poured more of themselves into FHU or who have more tirelessly served in the kingdom of God. They are loved by generations of Ćhristians and their influence is felt across the country and around the world. Though Jan went to her reward on October 22, 2024, Roy and Jan are worthy of honor because of the work they have done and impact they made together.

Roy and Jan met at FHC and married in 1966. They had a faithful and loving relationship for more than 58 years. They had three children: Meg, John and Rachel, and they were blessed with five grandchildren: Cyrus, Cora, Chelsea, Kai and Florine. Both Roy and Jan graduated from FHC, Jan in 1967 and Roy, who stayed for the third year Bible certificate, in 1968. Shortly after graduation from FHC, Roy began working for the college as a coach. He later served as the dean of students from 1980 to 1984 and as the VP of student services from 1985 to 1990. After that, he joined the Bible faculty full-time, serving in that capacity until his retirement in 2018. Jan also served the college, most notably as a librarian in the Lawhorn Library, with responsibility for the library's audiovisual holdings. She was also a long-time member of the FHU Associates, and she took great pleasure in feeding everyone from students to Christian friends to strangers. Roy, or "Coach," as he is affectionately known by many, served as director of Mid-South Youth Camp for many years. He and Jan were also very active in mission work, particularly in Haiti. Roy has made numerous trips to Haiti to conduct evangelistic and medical mission campaigns. Meanwhile Jan was tireless in her support role, helping to prepare shipping containers with relief supplies and maintaining relationships with brothers and sisters in Haiti. No one outworked Jan Sharp!

Perhaps the most notable role that Roy has played is "preacher." He has preached for more than 50 years at congregations across the



country, preaching long-term for churches in Memphis, Henderson and Linden. In addition, he has preached hundreds of gospel meetings in churches far and near and conducted marriage and family workshops at many more.

Roy and Jan Sharp have been exemplary servants of God. They are faithful friends, tireless workers in the church and passionate about the mission of God. It is our pleasure to dedicate the 2025 FHU Lectureship to this wonderful couple.


