Three years of college work (90 hours) will be necessary to complete the requirements for UT Memphis. UT Memphis prefers that a four-year degree be completed. The vast majority of those accepted have completed a baccalaureate degree.

IS CLINICAL EXPERIENCE REQUIRED OR HELPFUL? IF SO, HOW MANY HOURS?

Not required but considered by the admissions committee. In order to be competitive, the applicant should have observation and volunteering hours to report to the admissions committee.

AVERAGE GPA OF LAST ENTERING CLASS:

A minimum GPA of 2.75 is expected. Prospective applicants should strive to maintain a prescribed and cumulative grade point average well above a 3.00, but GPA scores are generally competitive at 3.5 or higher.

^{*}Non-science electives may be chosen from: Philosophy, Psychology, Business Administration, Economics, Public Speaking, Computer Science, and courses in the social sciences.

REQUIRED ENTRANCE EXAM:

The Dental Admissions Test is required. It should be taken no later than November 30 preceding the year of desired admission. The DAT can only be taken three (3) times. As of March 2025, the DAT is shifting from a 2 digit to a 3 digit score. The DAT examines applicants in four (4) sections: natural sciences, perceptual ability, reading comprehension, and quantitative reasoning. Scores received in these areas will also be averaged resulting in two additional scores for Science and Academics for a total of eight scores. Scores in each area may range from 200-600 points. An applicant with a DAT Academic Average score of 400 points or better will be considered competitive and may be asked for an interview.

Applicants are required to demonstrate, at the time of application, a minimum of 40 hours of dental observation/shadowing in a general dentistry setting. Applicants should consider observing in a variety of general dentistry settings.

REQUIRED ENTRANCE EXAM:

The Dental Admissions Test is required. It should be taken no later than November 30 preceding the year of desired admission. The DAT can only be taken three (3) times. Scores cannot be more then 2 years old. All applicants are required to complete Casper as part of the application. Casper is an online assessment that measure different competencies and attributes that we believe are important for our students. This assessment complements the other tools that we use for application review. In implementing Casper, we are trying to further enhance fairness and objectivity in our selection process. Applicants must complete Casper prior to application review and evaluation. To complete Casper, visit https://acuityinsights.app/casper. Note: we do not require Duet.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: January 1 of the year of anticipated entry, but earlier applications (fall prior to matriculation year) are better.

We do not have a specific number of shadowing hours however any dental experience is useful in helping to determine whether this is a good career choice. It is important for the applicant to observe in several dental offices to get a real feel for what the profession involves.

AVERAGE GPA OF LAST ENTERING CLASS:

Overall GPA: 3.78

Applicants should strive to maintain a GPA well above 3.00 to be competitive.

REQUIRED ENTRANCE EXAM:

The Dental Admissions Test is required. It should be taken no later than November 30 preceding the year of desired admission. The DAT can only be taken three (3) times. DAT must have been taken in the last three years.

^{**}Biochemistry is highly recommended in addition to the other 16 chemistry hours.

^{***} The requirement that at least 30 semester hours of non-science coursework be included in the predental program of study assures a broad general education which is the best preparation for a career in dentistry. Such non-science courses as English (six semester hours) and courses in the social sciences and humanities are recommended strongly to meet this requirement. Courses to enhance manual dexterity (sculpting, painting, etc.) also are encouraged. Physical education, military science, and similar courses are not acceptable as part of the minimum non-science requirements.

REQUIRED ENTRANCE EXAM:

The Dental Admissions Test is required. We encourage applicants to submit their applications as early as possible, even without a DAT score, as this will allow a preliminary review of the application. The DAT can only be taken three (3) times.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: The deadline is typically October 15.
