

## PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT

A **physician assistant** is trained in such tasks as screening patients, taking histories, performing physical exams, developmental exams for children, giving electrocardiograms and blood transfusions, managing emergencies, casting, and splinting. Physicians willing to accept responsibility may assign more complicated therapeutic procedures to the physician assistant who has demonstrated ability. The PA may also be responsible for keeping all patient records and patient follow up. This is the fastest growing career in health professions.

A baccalaureate degree, which includes prerequisite courses for the program, must be completed prior to enrollment with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.00 on a 4.00 scale for the prerequisites. Experience has shown that generally a cumulative GPA of at least a 3.00 must be presented for the applicant to be competitive. Must have at least a C on all prerequisites. Only 1 course may be left incomplete during the spring prior to admission.

**IS CLINICAL EXPERIENCE REQUIRED OR HELPFUL? IF SO, HOW MANY HOURS?**

Experience in direct medical patient care will add support to the application and is strongly recommended, as will demonstrated involvement in humanitarian service. Direct patient care experience may be either paid or voluntary. At least 200 patient contact hours are required. The applicant should have enough to recognize the physical and psychological demands of dealing with patients and to appreciate the challenges of being a healthcare professional. With more applications coming in, to be competitive an applicant will need additional hours beyond what is required. Harding will count working as a medical scribe as contact hours.) Shadowing a PA specifically is highly advised. At least 10 hours of shadowing is recommended, but more is beneficial. Shadowing of other health care professionals (e.g. nurse practitioner, physician, etc.) is also advised and should be included in the CASPA application.

**ADMISSION EXAM: GRE**

Taking the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) is also required. It must be completed by November 1 before you are admitted in the fall. No minimal score was given, but the typical PA student usually has a GRE score at or above the 40<sup>th</sup> percentile in each area.

Additionally, all applicants will be expected to have earned a 'C' or above in all prerequisite courses.

A baccalaureate degree, which includes prerequisite courses for the program, must be completed prior to enrollment with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.00 on a 4.00 scale for the prerequisites. Experience has shown that generally a cumulative GPA of at least a 3.00 must be presented for the applicant to be competitive. Must have at least a C on all prerequisites.

**IS CLINICAL EXPERIENCE REQUIRED OR HELPFUL? IF SO, HOW MANY HOURS?**

We require all applicants to be exposed to the PA profession by shadowing a practicing physician assistant. We do not have a set minimum number of hours. We prefer you seek quality interactions with a practicing PA rather than just accumulating higher quantity hours. We will ask you about your shadowing experience during the interview process. Virtual shadowing is not accepted.

Lipscomb does require all applicants have patient contact hours. However, there is no set minimum required number of hours. We are more interested in the type of experience and how that experience helps you understand patient care and the healthcare team. We prefer to see quality patient interactions, rather than an arbitrary number of hours. We will ask you about your patient contact experience during the interview process. Patient contact hours in high numbers are seriously recommended to be competitive. Volunteer experience and community service is also expected, but no set number of hours are expected.

**ADMISSION EXAM:** NONE Taking the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) is NOT required.

**APPLICATION DEADLINE:**

Applications are available through CASPA (Centralized Application Service for Physician Assistant) at [www.caspaonline.org/](http://www.caspaonline.org/). The application cycle begins April 1 and students should apply as soon as possible.

**OTHER INFORMATION:**

Many other factors are considered in the holistic review of the application, interview, and admissions process. They may include the following: communication skills, letters of recommendation, problem solving skills, professionalism, work experience, degree earned, research, volunteerism, interview performance, attitude, timeliness, and other factors that help differentiate those applicants that possess the highest likelihood of succeeding as part of the healthcare team as a physician assistant.

No online or hybrid science prerequisites will be accepted. Science courses labeled as "survey" or "introductory" will not be accepted (for clarification, please contact for approval). You may only use online course options to complete psychology requirements and/or medical terminology.

\*Due to the competitiveness of the selection process, all applicants are encouraged to take as many additional upper level science courses as possible. Not only do the courses provide information of academic performance, but they also assist in preparation for the rigorous program. The successful completion of these additional courses will assist in your competitiveness. Certain upper-level science courses have shown a strong correlation to successful completion of the rigors of the PA program. These sources include Immunology, Pathophysiology, Genetics, Molecular and Cellular Biology, Organic Chemistry & Biochemistry.

A baccalaureate degree, which includes prerequisite courses for the program, must be completed prior to enrollment with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.25 on a 4.00 scale. While any undergraduate major is acceptable, biology or chemistry majors will be the best prepared.

Last year's entering class had an average general GPA of 3.7, Science GPA of 3.76, a GRE combined score of 307 and had taken 5 upper division science courses.

### IS CLINICAL EXPERIENCE REQUIRED OR HELPFUL? IF SO, HOW MANY HOURS?

In the opinion of the PA program faculty, past medical experience provides a framework upon which students can build and facilitate the expansion of the fund of medical knowledge. Clinical experience is **required**. An applicant must log at least 250 hours of **direct** patient care. **All**

**Direct Patient Care hours must be logged at the time of submitting your application.**

**We do not accept updates sent to the program via email.**

Shadowing, volunteering, and medical mission exposure does not count toward direct patient care hours. Positions that qualify include: Medical Assistant, Surgical Technician, First Assistant, Scribe, CNA, LPN, RN, EMT/Paramedic, OT/PT or OT asst./PT asst., AT-C, Phlebotomist, RT, ER technician, Lab Technician, Clinical Pharmacy Technician-with client exposure, and Clinical Dietician. Positions that do NOT qualify are Personal Care Assistant, Pharmacy Technician-without clinical exposure, Unit Clerk, Camp Counselor, Counselor, and Social Worker. Clinical training hours for prior degrees obtained are not to be submitted in the application as direct patient care. **Only hours logged as an employee of any of the above clinical positions will be accepted. Please do not include hours accrued in training or working towards certification. All hours must be logged at the time of application submission.**

**At the time of submission, an applicant should have at least 10 hours logged of shadowing a physician assistant.** This provides a sufficient insight as to the role and duties of practicing physician assistants and is believed to be an accurate indicator of an individual's desire and commitment to the profession. Shadowing may be logged from multiple physician assistants. All hours logged should be obtained via direct clinical observation and not based on a personal relationship. Mission shadowing can be utilized in the case of direct patient care with a PA. Applicants will have until October 1st to log all shadowing hours in CASPA. The program does not accept email updates.

**ADMISSION EXAM: None**

Taking the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) is no longer required as of the 2024-2025 cycle.

A baccalaureate degree, which includes prerequisite courses for the program, must be completed prior to enrollment with a minimum CASPA cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.00 scale for the prerequisites.

Experience has shown that generally a cumulative GPA of at least a 3.0 must be presented for the applicant to be competitive. A grade of "C" or better must be made on any pre-requisite course. CLEP credit may not be used for any of the pre-requisites. AP credit may be accepted if the undergraduate institution counts it. Classes begin in January. All applicants must hold a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher learning. All applicants must have graduated by August 31 of the year prior to the program's matriculation.

**IS CLINICAL EXPERIENCE REQUIRED OR HELPFUL? IF SO, HOW MANY HOURS?**

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, we recognize that some applicants will not be able to obtain direct care experience or shadowing hours. We are waiving our minimum requirement for shadowing or direct care experience. We will give preference to those applicants that have a history of direct care experience. The Program considers it vital that prospective students enhance their knowledge of medicine through direct, patient-oriented clinical experience in a variety of settings. Such experience, which is frequently gained through volunteer work, should enable the student to acquire a greater understanding of the realities of medicine and provide an opportunity for service. In the past, the UTHSC program required 500 hours to be completed at the time of application submission, but majority of students had substantially more. In order to be competitive a student must gain those experience hours.

**ADMISSION EXAM: PA-CAT**

UTHSC will require the PA-CAT. There is no minimum score. The GRE is no longer accepted.

**APPLICATION DEADLINE:** September 1<sup>st</sup> (August 1<sup>st</sup> is preferred to be more competitive)

While any undergraduate major is acceptable, biology or chemistry majors will be the best prepared. Eighty science hours must be completed before applying to the program.

**IS CLINICAL EXPERIENCE REQUIRED OR HELPFUL? IF SO, HOW MANY HOURS?**

Patient care experience is valued, but no longer listed as required. Past medical experience provides a framework upon which students can build and facilitate the expansion of the fund of medical knowledge. The recent data provided shows an average of over 2800 hours of experience from students. Completion of a minimum of 40 hours shadowing with a Physician Assistant-Certified (PA-C), within the past 5 years is also required.

**OTHER REQUIREMENTS: VOLUNTEER/COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS**

Bethel requires the completion of a minimum of 25 hours of Community Service/Volunteering within the past 5 years.

**ADMISSION EXAM: GRE**

Taking the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) is also required. A minimum score of 300 is recommended. The PA-CAT is only recommended and does not improve or reduce admission likelihood.
